News from the MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT

The Grass

Someday in 2010 we expect to see the grass and when we do, the expectation is that it wintered well. The total lack of play will have been most beneficial to the high traffic areas, such as bridge and path entry and exit points. Tee surfaces, in particular par 3 tees, will have benefitted from the lack of play, also.

The Projects

All of the winter projects will have to be accomplished during the Spring. Bridge and irrigation work is still planned for hole #4. We will be building a foot and cart bridge from the

L-shaped fairway across the creek. The foot bridge will replace the existing foot bridge, at the end of the fairway, but will go straight across the top of the rough as opposed to walking down the creek bank. The cart bridge will be on the left side in the area of the dark brown house and is intended to reduce cart traffic along the creek bank, heading toward the old bridge. The irrigation work is intended to remove the cluster of valve boxes from the landing area of the L-shaped fairway and to redistribute the watering to prevent pooling. Additionally, work on #14 is intended to provide better grass surfaces in the latter part of the summer. Then we have concrete work to do at the bridges on holes #1, #4, and #7. The concrete work is part of the long term goals of the club to reduce the amount

of bare dirt and broken asphalt around the course.

The Upper Pond

The city has returned the management of the upper pond back to the Briarwood. A valve will be installed in the irrigation system, behind #17 green, which will allow us to maintain the level of the pond. Treated river water will be used to maintain the level as opposed to effluent water from the treatment plant. There should be fewer problems with algae by using the treated river water.

The Other Stuff

Because of the prolonged snow cover, items such as equipment repair, tee markers, irrigation and equipment storage buildings have been taken care of. This year there will also be a color option in the flags along with the grid pattern to help you locate pin position.



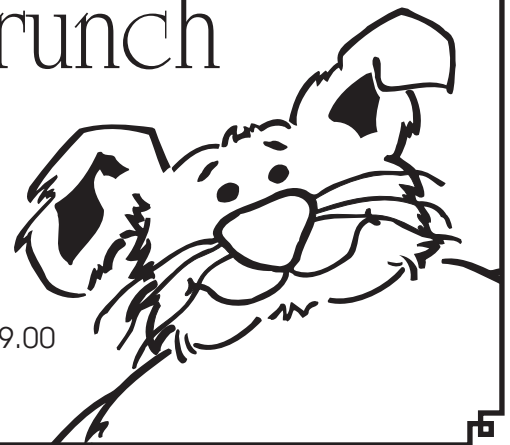

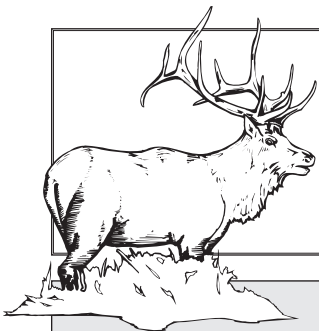
I'm sure that I will see many of you at the annual meeting, and hopefully we will start playing golf before too long.
